

Will's Place was made possible through the support of Governor Jay Nixon and the collaborative efforts between Ozark Center and the following organizations.












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Role of Psychological First Aid



- Provides compassionate support and presence
- Allows individuals to tell their story while normalizing their feelings and experience
- Assists in educating and clarifying what happened
- Assists with reframing the disaster
- Educates about what to expect
- Assists with reconnecting
- Encourages connection with available resources
- Assists with problem solving and plan of action
- Assists with developing preparedness plan

Skills for Psychological Recovery



- Used after PFA in the recovery weeks and months following any disaster or trauma
- SPR is a skills-training intervention designed to accelerate recovery and increase self-efficacy
- SPR's core skills include:
 - building problem-solving skills
 - promoting healthy activities
 - managing reactions
 - promoting helpful thinking





Map Your Neighborhood is a "9 step" all-hazards program designed to help neighbors prepare for disasters. In a disaster, your neighbors are your most immediate source of help. Traditional 9-1-1 responders may be quickly overwhelmed by demand. Some minor preparation and knowing what to do in the first hour of a disaster response may save a life, reduce the severity of injuries, and reduce the amount of damage that you, your family, and neighbors sustain.

Map Your Neighborhood (MYN)

The major goal of MYN is to prepare neighborhoods to be self-reliant during the first gold hours (72 hours and less) of a disaster

Being prepared to help your family and your neighbors brings peace of mind

Neighbors create a neighborhood map showing all homes in their area, names of residents, locations of exterior gas meters and propane tanks (that cause 67% of all house fires) as well as neighbors who may require a little extra help (elderly, persons with disabilities or small children)







School Messenger, Talk About It: a free, 24 hour communication tool that allows students to confidentially reach out for help using a cell phone or computer.

Offered to 5,000 students in grades 4 through 12 in November 2012. They can reach a school staff member or an Ozark Center counselor at any time, through an anonymous text or online messages.

Though it is anonymous, the school can trace messages that are threatening to the student or others in order to take immediate action.


