On May 22, 2011, the destructive force of the EF-5 tornado, destroyed or damaged 7,500 residential dwellings, which left 9,200 citizens displaced; 3,500 homes were totally destroyed. Since that date Habitat for Humanity, Convoy of Hope, Rebuild Joplin, Samaritan's Purse with Forest Park Church, Operation Blessing, and Fuller Center for Housing, along with many other unsung organizations and individuals have been the driving force to bring our most impacted neighborhoods back to life.

For this, the 5th anniversary of the recovery, showcasing the return of the neighborhoods most impacted is a proud part of our recovery story.
